PORT CONDITION MODIFIED ZULU ANTICIPATED FOR THE PORT OF WILMINGTON, NORTH CAROLINA

September 28, 2022

The Captain of the Port (COTP) North Carolina anticipates setting **Port Condition Modified Zulu for the Port of Wilmington** at 1600 on September 29, 2022 in preparation for the potential weather impact of Hurricane Ian. The <u>National Weather Service</u> predicts Gale Force winds (34 knots or 39 mph) will reach Frying Pan Shoals Lighted Buoy 16 (LLNR 835) within **40** hours. Pleasure craft are advised to seek safe harbor. Vessels desiring to enter, transit, or remain within this Captain of the Port Zone must comply with the following requirements:

- 1. All self-propelled oceangoing vessels over 500GT, all oceangoing barges and their supporting tugs, and all tank barges over 200GT must be either securely moored at a facility for the duration of the storm, embarked a pilot and headed inbound to a receiving facility, or departed and clear of the sea buoy not later than 1600 on September 29, 2022.
- 2. Passenger ferries may continue operations at the discretion of the vessel master and/or operator.

The COTP further anticipates reopening the port to inbound and outbound traffic as soon as it is safe for the Cape Fear Pilots to resume offshore operations.
